- RD 115** Academic Thinking and Reading (or higher) or placement in RD 120 based upon results of the college's placement test
- B1 231** Human Anatomy and Physiology (completed within the past seven years)
- MTH 95** Intermediate Algebra (or higher). This requirement cannot be waived by a placement test score

Completion of more science and general education requirements increases a student's potential for admission.

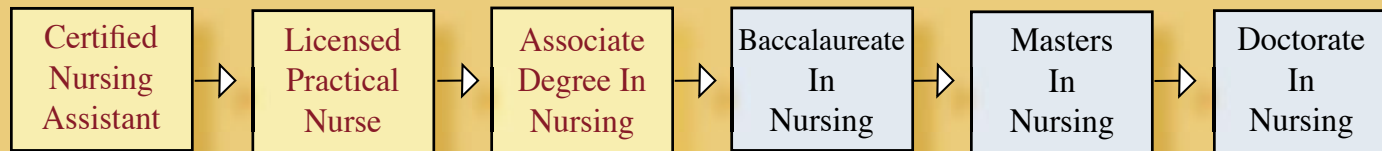
